

NEW individually tailored post graduate programs in arbitration offered by the Swiss Arbitration Academy in cooperation with the Universities of Lucerne and Neuchâtel

After the completion of the second successful Certificate of Advanced Studies (CAS) in Arbitration program the Swiss Arbitration Academy decided to make its programs accessible to a broader audience. Based on popular demand our programs now also cater to participants whose work commitments do not allow them the time to complete all aspects of a university degree as well as to those looking for a more budget conscious choice.

The Swiss Arbitration Academy's tested module system gives participants maximum possible flexibility. An individually tailored program can be chosen and amended by selecting modules based on whether a participant is looking for a comprehensive degree, practical training or is interested in individual topics.

Starting in April 2016 participants can attend the five day modules individually for a cost of only CHF 2,200 per module. A participant who has attended modules two, three and four has received training incorporating all stages of arbitral proceedings and is awarded an **Arbitration Practitioner (ArbP)** diploma from the Swiss Arbitration Academy. The tuition fee for participants that register for the practice orientated ArbP program (three modules) is CHF 4,900.

The internationally accredited **CAS in Arbitration** is a comprehensive and demanding course. The SAA is proud that this unique program is endorsed by institutions such as the Milan Chamber of Arbitration (CAM), the German Institution of Arbitration (DIS), ICC Switzerland, the Kigali International Arbitration Centre (KIAC), the Swiss Chamber's Association (SCAI), the Stockholm Chamber of Commerce (SCC) and the Vienna International Arbitration Centre (VIAC).

The tuition fee for the CAS in Arbitration is CHF 9,900 with discounts offered for early registration and students. The CAS in Arbitration requires participants to attend one module more than the ArbP, pass a written exam and to submit a research paper. The new flexibility offered also gives participants a choice to complete the CAS in Arbitration in one year or, to complete the course in as many steps and over the period of time that best suits the participant's individual situation.
